

## Christ Church Primary School PE Spending Plan 2021/22

The school will receive a total of £20,610 this academic year split over two payments in November 2021 and June 2022.

### Increasing participation in sport and PE clubs

Our school offers a range of school clubs accessed by children from Key Stages 1 and 2. Many of our clubs offer some form of physical education for example hockey, football and basketball.

### Providing opportunities for children to compete

Owing to the Covid-19 pandemic disruption across the last two academic years, opportunity for sporting competitions and festivals has significantly decreased. We are now pleased to say that competitions are again being organised and we will be entering different competitions across the Borough of Kingston to provide opportunities for many pupils to take part. We will be entering competitions such as hockey tournaments, indoor cricket, tag rugby festivals, cross-country and football in partnership with other primary schools within our cluster and local authority. We will arrange tournaments and fixtures between the primary schools, whilst offering routes for our more gifted children, allowing them to compete against other children at a higher level. It is equally important to provide children of all abilities and activity levels with opportunities to participate and therefore will be offering a range of sporting events, both inside (e.g. inter house competitions) and outside of school. New sports clubs at lunchtimes will be introduced to showcase new sports and offer opportunities for all groups of children.

Swimming and water safety opportunities which have not been available during the Covid-19 pandemic will restart to ensure children can swim competently and confidently by the end of Key stage 2.

One of the key strands of the sports funding is to enhance the skills of our school staff so that the quality of PE and sport that is delivered is enhanced. Qualified sports coaches will work alongside staff to deliver lessons and support planning and delivery of PE. Working in this way will develop teacher confidence, competence and expertise and the school will benefit from high quality planning, modelling and teaching.

The money received for the academic year 2021 - 2022 and those monies carried forward (unspent during restrictions owing to the Covid-19 pandemic) will be budgeted and spent as follows:

- Gymnastics coaching £1870
- Hockey coaching £2640
- Basketball coaching £2160
- Squash Coaching £1080
- Tennis coaching £1500
- Sports Cool- specialist sports groups £3000
- Clothing and equipment £2100
- Sports Day – venue, medals/stickers and equipment £450
