Beginning to explore place value to work with number to 20.		Building on the ideas from the Autumn Term with a focus on place value to work with numbers to 100. Solve problems including grouping and sharing (multiplying and dividing) using objects and pictorial representations. Recognise and find halves and quarters in different forms. Exploring measures, time and shape and space.		Building on the first two terms' learning, with a focus on application through pattern finding and problem solving. Telling the time to the hour and half past. Further developing the vocabulary to compare and describe measures, including capacity, length and time, as well as shapes.
